<u> Leopard Track - 2017</u>



The Leopard Track it's called by us, like this, since 2011 when I and my eternal friend Toni, spotted an Atlas leopard in a remote area on the river bank of the Oued Draa.

Now that you haven't decided yet or, if you have and it's the first time you are going to travel with us or, if you have travel with us, but you're forgotten, here it is some things that are important to know:

GENERAL CONDITIONS

- 1. Our service it's similar to the one given by the desert guides and it's charged by the day for a certain number of days regarding the whole trip.
- 2. The voyage has a predefine course that could be changed due to weather conditions, politic changes, or if one of the participants has some trouble, because once the trip has started we go by Alexandre Dumas's musketeer's slogan: "One for all and all for one".
- 3. All the costs are pay by the participant but having the liberty to decide where to sleep, eat, etc. However we suggest the necessary reserves as a group so that we can have a price reductions and we can stay all together.
- 4. The passport must have at least 6 months of expiring date and the car if it's not the owner who's taking it, there will be needed a declaration of consent from the owner. The car insurance can be made at the border.
- 5. It's mandatory to have a personal voyage insurance (that can be made as a group with ours from ACP).
- 6. The trip registration it's effective with the payment of the ferry ticket and the presentation of the trip insurance.

PREPARATION

- 1. Open to all 4x4 cars, preferably with a transfer box with High and Low gear.
- 2. Full check up. In doubt replace it because eider the track or the desert are forgiven.
- 3. All Terrain tires in good shape.
- 4. Some consumables, such as: engine oil; cooler; fuses; etc.
- 5. One compressor to fill up the tires and a tow strap.
- 6. Camping stuff.
- 7. There are excellent groceries and markets in Morocco where you can by anything, less our snacks, namely: ham, sausages, good cheese and wine.
- 8. The GPS it's not essential, but if you have it and if it accepts Garmin files, you could lead the caravan on the tracks.
- 9. VHF radio it's better than the CB. We use both and they allow us to exchange ideas and emotions as we go along.
- 10. The trip starts at home. Inform yourself where we will pass by and take with you maps and tourist guides.
- 11. Pharmacy: we have one, but it's not enough, eider for all or for all the diseases. Take yours with you, without forgetting sun protector and mosquito spray.
- 12. Take the minimum things as possible. The lighter the car, lesser will be the effort in all his components and easier it will be to overcame obstacles and sand areas.
- 13. Morocco it's a fascinating country of contrasts and a welcoming people that respects the others. Bring good will and common sense.
